### What Pennsylvania law says

3542. Right-of-way of pedestrians in crosswalks.

- (a) General rule.—When traffic-control signals are not in place or not in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-ofway to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection.
- (b) Exercise of care by pedestrian.—No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close as to constitute a hazard.
