CAT Programs

Bike Somewhere Today

Educating, encouraging, and empowering people to bicycle more often, for more reasons. From learning how to take care of one’s own bike to honing essential on-bike skills, CAT believes that biking should be fun! CAT offers customized content paired with national-level programs to make transportation transformative!

CAT Bicycle Cooperative

Open 5 days per week for direct mentorship and volunteering for individuals and families. CAT’s home for activities and community where no experience is needed to become a mechanic, volunteer, or repair one’s own bike.



Bike Mechanics Classes

Park Tool School Basic Maintenance, Advanced Mechanics, Wheel Building, Women’s Clinics. Classes are held at CAT. Over 750 adult students since 2006.



Bike Traffic Skills Classes

CyclingSavvy (American Bicycling Education Association), Smart Cycling (League of American Bicyclists). Classes on-site at CAT and at partner locations.



Bike Basics and Bike2Work Basics

Offering outreach presentations and workshops supporting bicycling for useful transportation, enjoyment, and health. Single-day workshops and multi-session programs held at CAT or partner locations. Organizing Lehigh Valley Bike to Work Week annually in May, with rides in Allentown, Bethlehem, and Easton.



CAT Programs (continued)

Youth Bike Education (Bike Smart LV)

Bicycle safety for kids in grades K-12 around the Lehigh Valley. Includes large-scale Bike Day Events (30-150 kids) and small-scale after-school Bike Club events (5-10 kids). Over 28,451 youth participants since 2004.



Holiday Bikes Program

Refurbishing youth bicycles during the winter holidays for families with financial hardship. 1,043 children have received bikes at no cost since 2017.

Everybody Rides LV!

Organizing group bike rides around the Lehigh Valley. Includes CAT weekend bakery rides, ice cream rides, women’s rides, Halloween costume rides, holiday lights bike rides, bike camping trips, and rides with partnering organizations.

Bike Transportation Advocacy

Supporting community investment in bike-friendly infrastructure, traffic calming (see below), bike boulevards, short/long-term bike parking, and multi-use trail connectivity with important destinations. Advocating a culture shift that encourages people to drive with care.

Walk/Wheel in Our Community

Yield-to-Pedestrians Initiative

Walking and rolling (wheelchair), the original form of transportation, is also a fundamental form of exercise. CAT’s Yield to Pedestrians Initiative educates drivers about crosswalk laws and encourages them to “Slow Down and Look Around”.



Traffic Calming Advocacy

Raising awareness that excessive vehicle speed is one of the biggest factors of crashes, injuries, and deaths. Encouraging municipal, county, and PennDOT projects to incorporate design elements that promote motor vehicle speeds that are safe for pedestrians (and bicyclists), including most importantly the width and number of lanes, and as appropriate: high-visibility crosswalks, curb extensions, and crosswalk lighting. Urging 25mph speed limits to be adopted for city/borough streets where people walk/wheel and ride bicycles.

Speed Studies/Enforcement on local roads

Using CAT-owned radar gun to document driver behavior where traffic calming is needed. Urging equitable enforcement of speed limits to encourage motorists to drive more slowly.



Explore Local Trails

🌳 Promoting THE LINK Trails Network

Helping people discover trails that take them places right here in the Lehigh Valley. Distributing trail maps and having conversations with bicyclists and pedestrians to advise useful trails based on people's abilities, needs, and goals. Includes trails for transportation and recreation.



🌳 Advocating Trail Connectivity

Expanding and maintaining trail connectivity offering users a more robust network of trails that links places where people live, work, and shop.

🌳 Encouraging Trail Etiquette

Topics include: Be Alert-Communicate and Cooperate, Slow Down When Passing, E-bike Etiquette, Enjoy every sandwich, and more.

🌳 Basic Needs

Urging municipalities and other trail owners to offer year-round public restrooms and drinking water.



Ride LANTA Bus

🚌 Transit Advocacy

Promoting frequent, efficient service, and routes across the Lehigh Valley. Advocating safe, clean, and comfortable bus stops.



🚌 Amenities

Requesting landowners to support and maintain bus shelters, benches, and amenities where bus routes pass their property.

🚌 Bike-on-Bus

Promoting use of on-bus bike racks.

🚌 Transit Triathlon

Seeing every transit rider as a pedestrian or bicyclist.

🚌 Outreach

Sharing information about LANTA's newest upgrades, such as Enhanced Bus Service (EBS) Blue/Green Lines, and Transit App.





2025 CAT Highlights

2025 marked 33 years of CAT's service to the Lehigh Valley! From helping families learn what it means to have a safe, working bicycle for their children, to training adults to be awesome bike mechanics so they in turn can help others, to helping individuals obtain and maintain bicycles for essential transportation, CAT is working every day to enhance mobility and community.

In 2025, the CAT Bicycle Cooperative was our hub for rebuilding bikes and hosting bike mechanics classes with all kinds of people. 2025 culminated in December with our successful move to downtown Bethlehem including a walking bike train moving 400 donated bikes with volunteer power!

Our group bike rides went further with more rides than ever. Notable CAT rides in 2025 kicked off with Bill's Polar Bear Ride, then progressed with: Lehigh Valley Bike to Work rides in Allentown and Bethlehem, beginner bike overnight for everyone to Green Lane, a women's bike overnight to Delaware Water Gap, and group bike rides on every trail in THE LINK Trail Network. CAT promoted the useful trifecta of riding LANTA bus, being a pedestrian, and using on-bus bike racks.

Our partnerships with community groups expanded. Adult clients participating in our Bike2Work Basics program built their bikes at CAT in Bethlehem and rode them for essential transportation all over the Lehigh Valley.

CAT Volunteers/Leadership/Staff

- 3,640 board volunteer hours by 14 board members
- 3,327 volunteer hours by 78 CAT Bicycle Cooperative volunteers
- 2,080 paid staff hours and 780 volunteer staff hours
- 300 committee volunteer hours by additional CAT committee members
- 370 staff-hours contributed by CAT Ride Leaders for community group bike rides
- 196 staff-hours of bike education classes taught by CAT Adult Instructors
- 344 staff-hours taught by CAT Youth Education instructors

CAT Bicycle Cooperative

- 2,550 visits served
- Open 50 weeks => 200 days => 900 hours open to the public
- 394 total volunteers with 99 new volunteers in 2025
- 24 adult volunteers with special needs
- 419 total bikes rebuilt and renewed!
- 170 youth bikes awarded to children via CAT Holiday Bikes
- 65 youth bikes refurbished and awarded at schools and events
- 95 adult bikes refurbished by/for low-income residents
- 89 adult bikes refurbished by volunteer mechanics
- 450 tires recycled and 4,200 pounds metal recycled



CAT Adult Classes

- 28 students in 11 Basic Bike Maintenance Classes
- 13 students in 4 Advanced Bike Mechanics Classes
- 9 students in 1 Smart Cycling Class and 3 students in 1 Wheel Building Class
- 19 ride leaders in First Aid/CPR certification (taught by American Heart Assoc. instructors)

CAT Membership

- 404 total memberships
- 236 memberships meeting or exceeding suggested donation (\$75/year)
- 168 memberships, low-income/low-cost (\$0-74)

Adult Bike Programs & Rides

- 583 participants in 75 group bike rides including bakery & ice cream rides, women's ride, Halloween ride, bike overnights to Delaware Water Gap, Green Lane, and Jim Thorpe, Waterways on Wheels ride, Hexenkopf ride, ride to Emmaus for movie screening of "The Engine Inside". Rides covered every trail in THE LINK Trail Network and streets to connect them!
- 68 clients participated in CAT's Bike2Work Basics program!
- Lehigh Valley Bike to Work Week Rides with Mayors in Allentown & Bethlehem
- 9 new CAT Ride Leaders with enhanced 10-part training program (21 ride leaders total)

CAT Youth Education

- 1,147 youth participants in 32 Bike Education Events with 21 staff members/volunteers
- 440 bicycle helmets fitted for youth
- 10 sessions of CAT Bike Club @William Penn and Thomas Jefferson Elementary Schools
- Bike Day events at Marvine Elementary, Ritter Elementary Schools, Tatamy Boro, Bushkill Township, Bethlehem Township, and Thomas Jefferson Community Day

CAT Bicycle Cooperative Expansion

January 2026

CAT’s search for a new home began in 2022 with an extensive real estate search. Key search criteria for the new facility included a pedestrian, bicycle, and public transit-friendly location central to the Lehigh Valley. Needs for the Bicycle Cooperative included a one-floor layout to make it reasonable for shuffling bikes around, a large open space for holding bike classes, and a large storage area for donated bikes and parts.

In mid-2024, the City of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Parking Authority approached CAT with an idea that checked all the boxes for CAT. To build a new CAT in downtown Bethlehem would offer CAT a central connection to the community. A press conference in October 2024 revealed the plan to the public.

In early 2025, the Walnut Street Garage was in the planning stages and CAT had the opportunity to work with the Bethlehem Parking Authority and the engineering firm, THA Consulting, to lay out the space with everything we needed: an open concept office and workshop with bright windows, space and excellent lighting for five (5) bike workstations with air lines for a new air compressor, a durable floor, a partition wall to hide 60 shelves of small parts and 15 racks of tires, 4 storage “barns” in the upper levels of the garage to organize 400 youth and adult bicycles.

During Summer of 2025, CAT volunteers built new workbenches, procured new tools, organized parts and supplies at old CAT. The garage opened in November with major construction in CAT’s space completed in December in the middle of the holidays. CAT’s build-out began and lasted 3½ weeks with volunteer crews working 12 hours a day. Our ribbon cutting and grand opening was on January 23 & 24, 2026 with over 200 people attending.
